

Sauder Furniture, Inc.

In 1907, John F. Sauder purchased the furniture business of Wm. F. Frolick. John Sauder managed the business until 1919 when his son, Frank, returned home from World War I and bought into the enterprise. According to the company history, in 1924, Frank added the undertaking business and renamed the business F.D. Sauder and Sons Furniture and Undertaking.

When World War II ended in 1946, Frank's three sons, Howard, Don and Jerry, purchased the business. The sons oversaw many changes and several expansions over the years. In 1959, the Sauder's excavated under the two existing buildings for more display area. In 1966, the brothers removed the roof and added a second story to the building. The last major expansion was in 1976 when they removed the existing building to the south and added a larger basement and two floors.

In 1976, Sauder Furniture, Inc. was formed. In 1984, the fourth generation of Sauder family members -- Bob, Harold, Jeff and Skip -- bought stock in the corporation to continue the family tradition.

Today, Sauder Furniture, Inc. is a full-service business that offers flooring, window treatments, along with many furniture styles and accessories. Professional designers work with customers to meet all of their decorating needs.
